Dear Urban and Multibenefit Drought Relief Program Review Committee:

Serving as Executive Director for the Russian River Watershed Association (RRWA), I am writing to express my enthusiastic support of the application submitted by the Mendocino County Russian River Flood Control & Water Conservation District (RRFC) to the California Department of Water Resources for the On-Farm Groundwater Recharge Multi-Benefit Demonstration Project.

The RRWA is a coalition of ten public agencies in Sonoma and Mendocino Counties that have come together to coordinate regional programs in the Russian River watershed for clean water, habitat restoration, and watershed enhancement. The RRWA provides support to communities throughout the Russian River watershed and works to enhance awareness of special studies and water resource programs funded through grants.

This project will demonstrate the potential benefits of diverting wet-season surplus flows from the Russian River in the Ukiah Valley for on-farm groundwater recharge to increase Ukiah Valley groundwater basin storage, improve dry-season river and tributary flows, and decrease the need for releases from Lake Mendocino to maintain instream flows. The proposed groundwater recharge pilot project will help advance drought preparedness, aquifer replenishment, and reduce flood risk for the benefit all Ukiah Valley residents and stakeholders. Information from this demonstration project will inform an understanding of groundwater quality, pumping impacts on surface water flows, and other water supply management and sustainability efforts.
