<u>Discussion</u> Elizabeth (Windsor) – The co-permittees just had their monthly meeting with the Water Board. The Water Board is working on their permit with a draft anticipated in December.

The Russian River Watershed Association complies with ADA requirements and will attempt to reasonably accommodate individuals with disabilities upon request.

They would like a presentation to the group on the Rising Waters project. There is confusion on OWOW and ordering. The Co-Permittees would like the CASQA OWOW meeting invites forwarded to them.
